TRADEcho 3.6 Release Production Go-Live Update – Monday 21 September 2020

Further to the Service Announcement sent on 18 August 2020, [001/18082020](#), this is to inform customers that the go-live of TRADEcho 3.6 release will be **Monday 21 September 2020**, subject to internal testing and customer readiness.

TRADEcho 3.6 release includes the following changes:

- Increased number of permitted entries in the csv file for upload.
- Enhanced logic for determining the appropriate TargetAPA for UK and EEA ToTV.
- Re-introduced the Last Market lookup functionality. Customers can now enter a MIC in the Last Market field. SRR will then determine in accordance within its Rules if this is considered a valid Venue MIC.
